Wooden Grade Crossings

Materials.

- In HO scale I use 3/32 X 3/32 square pieces of balsa wood for code 100 rail. It will take 9 pieces of wood cut to a length a bit longer than the width of the road. It will take five pieces to fit between the rails and four for the outsides. For other scales use a small or larger size of wood. The wood should be close the width of a tie but not larger than.
- You will also need Elmer's white glue or testers glue. Either works and neither sticks the wood to the tie where it can't be removed at a later date if you decide to change the road to another location.
- On occasion you may need some straight pins to hold the wood in place while drying. For example where the crossing is on a curved piece of track.

Single edge razor blade and a fine grit sandpaper.

Track Preparation.

It's best that there be no nails through the ties at the point where the crossing will be. Next using a pencil mark the boundaries of the road approaching the track on both sides. If your track has already been ballasted clean all the ballast off and above the ties. The wood pieces have to sit flat on the ties.

Wood Placement.

- Test fit 5 pieces of wood between the rails making sure there will be flange way space next
- Glue them in place by putting the glue on each piece of wood and placing on the ties. After all 5 pieces have been placed check the centering where they extend a short piece beyond each side of your road.
- Use stick pins to hold them in place if needed. Place the pins in the flange ways and or at the ends. Do not put the pins through the wood.
- Next, glue the outside pieces in place, notice that the pieces next to the rails on the outside will sit a bit higher since they are on the tie plates and spikes. This is normal and the single edge razor blade will help with this after they have dried in place. Again use straight pins if needed. Wait 24 hours for all to dry.

Final Shaping.

This next step is the key to a good crossing. First we need to shave down the two pieces that stick above the rails on the outside. Using the razor blade shave it in small bites. If you try to cut it off in one easy stroke from end to end the grain of the wood may cause the razor blade to cut through the piece of wood as it pries the entire piece of wood off the ties. No big deal if this happens—and it will, just glue some more pieces back down and wait for them to dry before trying again. It's best if you take small strokes towards the end from a quarter to half inch back from the end. Then come back another quarter inch

- and remove a bit more. Once you have gotten more than half way start from the other end and repeat till the wood is smooth with the top of the rail. Repeat with other side.
- Next will be to do the wood between the rails, using the same method as with the outside pieces. Once there is no wood above the rails it's time to shape the 5 inside pieces. Bevel the ends so that any coupler pins hanging down won't snag. Then bevel inwards the corners at the flange ways. Then sand smooth.

Final Step.

 Once the shaping is done it's time to stain it. I use burnt umber acrylic paint with a wet brush. I have used brown boot polish with some black over that. The paint last longer though. If you want oil stains just add a light amount of black paint or alcohol diluted ink. Black boot polish will work good and give it a bit of a shine like oil.









