#### **FIRST PLACE**

Bob Frankrone's switching modules. He built these two modules as a unit when he was a member of the K&I RR club many years ago. It was designed as a switching module so that it could be used a stand-alone layout.

It was last on display at the Galt House during the MCR 2017 Regional Convention and was set-up for operations for convention attendees. Because it is a travelling layout, it has limited scenery, and all the buildings are removable as is the trackwork located where the two modules are joined.

#### **SECOND PLACE**

Diorama by Ed Brennan MMR® . Ed originally built it as a stand-alone 24" x 28" module diorama. It is now incorporated in his home layout.

On the high line is an L&N E-6 #750 (Broadway Limited Imports), below on the bridge is an L&N Little Woody caboose (Wright Track/L&N Historical Society) punctuating a manifest freight of PFE reefers below.

Some of the materials and kits used: The bridge is a Walthers truss bridge (2-track modified to single-track) with guard rails added, Micro-Engineering steel piers and girder sections weathered with rust and dark gray pastels. The trees are by Bob Kuchler MMR®



#### **THIRD PLACE**

Rick Geerts' module: The "Other Side of the Tracks".

This is a 4' x 4' self-standing module which in the future will be attached as part of his layout.

There are 4 kits used: The drive-in is a Walthers kit. The drive-In sign is by Miller Engineering. The Strip Club is a Downtown Deco DD1035 Kitty Korner kit with Miller Engineering lights installed. The tavern is also a Downtown Deco DD1040 Trackside Tavern kit with a Miniatures Lighting beer light. The abandoned house is a Suydam kit with a scratch-built barn. The cars and trucks are from Walthers, Kibri, and Busch with Evan Designs flashing lights.

#### **BUILDING THE NEW K&I CLUB WORLD HEADQUARTERS**

I was at the new K & I World Headquarters early last year (just before COVID lockdown) with a group of members. We were setting up our primary layout and someone said "we are just a group of guys that like to run trains." Made me think... since we lost our clubhouse in Buckner, I rarely get to run trains. Seems like I do everything but.

In January 2017 we were notified that we had to vacate the old Buckner Firehouse in two weeks. We scrambled to find a storage option (settled on renting two PODS). We tore down the layout, and packed our stuff. We built racks in the PODS for the modules and stuffed all we could into them. The leftover stuff was stored at members' homes.

In the middle of this, we discovered that the "environmentally controlled" location for our PODS wasn't as we'd thought. So, to save money, we moved to a different storage location. We rented a truck and built shelves in it. Loaded up and moved, then unloaded the truck and removed the shelves. We had to rebuild shelves in the new storage and pack it all in as best we could.

We were comfortable in Buckner and had casually been looking for a new location. But now, we were homeless and desperate to find a new place. Anytime we were out driving, we were looking for an empty place that might be suitable. But no one wanted to rent us an affordable space.

found one that would accommodate us, but the rent for commercial property is expensive. However, after some discussion, they offered low rent in trade for some "sweat equity". And, after negotiation of a 38page lease, we had a new home at 2621 South 4th Street in Louisville near to the University of Louisville. It was only a concrete shell so here's where the "sweat equity" comes in. We had to insulate the ceiling, sweep the floor, repair the gas heater and get it certified, build an ADA compliant restroom with a water heater, sweep the floor, insulate the walls, install steel studs and partial walls, run conduit and electric lights, acquire and hang lights and fans - oh, and sweep the floors. We had to make sure everything was to code including the EXIT sign, fire extinguisher, etc.

The place looked great thanks to Mike Berry, the lead for this project, and the skilled (and unskilled)

Now, we could bring in our layouts. Again, we rented a truck. We took down, packed up and moved the traveling layout. Then we packed up our primary layout stuff from storage and moved it. The traveling layout was set up, and we started unboxing the primary layout stuff and try to figure out where it would fit.

This place wasn't as big as the firehouse so we had to make some difficult compromises and come up with a new layout design using our existing modules and scenery as best we could. Wish we could have built all new but we just didn't have the funds.

Then, the COVID lockdown happened. Our work sessions stopped, but dedicated members persisted, coming in, one or two at a time, to work on this or that and keep progress going. These very diligent, skilled members got the layouts up and running and the scenery

coming together. In spite of COVID, things started looking great.

We couldn't get together in person during the lockdown so we sent out newsletters, figured out Zoom, and started having virtual meetings and Zoom get-togethers. We kept the K & I business going virtually.

Then, as members got vaccinated, we started getting together again with small work sessions to work on this and that, and meeting in small groups to run trains.

Now, we are having weekly, face-to-face get togethers, work sessions, and talking about having our business meetings face-to-face at the new K & I World Headquarters. It's been a long time coming, but we are back. Still have some tracks to lay and scenery to install but we are running trains and the camaraderie is great.
