All nominations must be in an email to Division 8 and must clearly state the reason for nominating the person by listing their qualifications and must state the name of the member who is making the nomination. It will all be conveniently spelled out for you in the nomination email you'll receive on August 5th.

A Division 8 member can only receive the Silver Spike award once. To see a list of recipients, go here - <u>Silver Spike Award Recipients</u> There you'll see a long list of Division 8 members who, as it reads on the award plaque, *Holds the railroad together*, symbolizes the strength of the road, and shine as one of the stars to guide us down the track.

The minimum service criteria are:

Served as a Division 8 officer or trustee for at least one full term **OR** Served on Division 8 committee(s) such as train show, membership, picnic, etc., for at least four years, **OR** Volunteers on a regular basis to work at Division 8 functions such as train shows, meets, conventions, etc. for at least four years.

If there are qualified nominees, an election will take place by email ballot in September. In the event there is a sole nominee, the nominee may be given the Silver Spike award by a motion of the board of directors to have the Silver Spike awarded by acclamation.

If you have any questions, just reply when you receive nomination information on August 5th.

The first, second, and third place winners for the 2023-2024 Charlie Keeling Virtual Model Contest year were announced at the Division 8 picnic on Saturday, July 20. Third place is Steve Lasher with 22 points for the year, skillfully transforming models into accurate prototypes. Second place is Bob Frankrone with 26 points for the year, a long-time active modeler on the local, regional and national levels. First place is Rick Maloney with 28 points for the year, returning to the contest with a very strong showing.

During this contest year we had 18 modelers participate with 60 total entries, returning to the pre-pandemic levels of 17 modelers and 58 entries back in the 2018-2019 contest year, but with a massive increase from 296 votes cast then to 429 votes cast now. Our winners receive contest certificates and Scale Reproductions gift cards awarded as prizes. Congratulations!

To escape the Ohio Valley heat, we took a week-long trip to Minnesota last month, visiting relatives, friends, and model railroaders while we were there. Many thanks go out to Thomas Gasior MMR® in the Twin Cities Division of the Thousand Lakes Region for arranging the layout visits and operating session visit. Most everyone knows of his Splitrock Mining Company model railroad. Dan Dossa's Minnesota Commercial layout is an interesting exercise in compressing two prototype industrial areas into a single space the size of a spare bedroom. I'd heard a lot about it, but seeing it in person really made the difference. Again, a lot of ingenious things going on there. You may see a few of those ingenious things from both layouts implemented on the Santa Cruz & Felton someday.

Lastly, there was the operating session on Dave Vos' Cumberland Northern Railway. The crew was a little light the night I visited, but I'm pretty sure all the trains on the order board completed their runs. Only one train with a timetable – the doodlebug. I ran that first, and it gave me a good look at the railroad. The next train was way more complicated and more than once I had to get out of the way of several through freights in one of the towns I was working. The railroad ran smoothly while I was there, with only a single minor throttle hiccup. The best part of working on Dave's model railroad was the crew. I felt like a member of the group almost immediately. Everyone was willing to fully answer any questions I had about the operations and it was a totally friendly, non-competitive atmosphere in the train room. I'd go back and run with any of those guys any day, anywhere. Yet another really enjoyable model railroading experience with a group of total strangers who became friends very quickly. MODEL RAILROADING IN THE THOUSAND LAKES STATE

Fred and Barbara Soward took a trip to Minnesota in July to visit friends and relatives. While there Fred had the opportunity to visit some layouts of members of the Twin Cities Division of the Thousand Lakes Region of the NMRA.

locomotive to the left of the yard office, they can check the yard office "fax machine" in the yellow lock box on the fascia, between the throttles, for additional train order or instructions.





Coming out of West Staging, a train exits straight through the M&K Wye and runs across the entire layout, to come back to M&K Wye where the station name is then "Vicker." It then uses the Vicker Wye (aka the M&K Wye) to turn the train and go back westbound across the layout, turns at the M&K Wye, and backs into West Staging.


