

FROM THE ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT

Another busy month with just a little bit of travel. We did make a trip to the Smoky Mountains at the end of August, well after I submitted last month's column to Bob Dawson. I was originally planning to attend the National Narrow Gauge Convention in Pittsburgh, but three days out, I decided to stay home instead.

There's been a whole lot of homabed laid down and painted in the basement. All of Watsonville Junction Yard is laid down. I've been working on creating the turnouts for that location while also working on my November presentation. Some of the turnouts will be in place soon and then we'll be able to start up mini-operating sessions down there again. With any luck at all, we might even have the sub-roadbed in place through Watsonville and into Santa Cruz before Thanksgiving.

Russ Weis has been steadily working on structures on his layout. He's enlisted the help of several people, including Chris Broughton, Bob Kuchler, and Stan White. And, there's a new bridge going in on the east end of Syracuse! So, another grade crossing to toot your horn and blow your whistle when you're running a train on the main. Russ and I've also been doing some troubleshooting on a couple of issues with the signals. Not any showstoppers, but there are a couple of annoying things that need a bit of tweaking.

There's been quite a bit of progress on Tom Guenthner's new layout. He's slowed down a bit on the scenery and I think he's just about finished laying track. The current focus is on wiring. Slow, but sure, we've been putting in the wiring for a few tracks every couple of weeks. Eric Waggoner has helped with the project as well. We solder and drop the feeders below the layout, connect them to the DCC bus, and leave it with Tom to check/verify/troubleshoot. Then we do it all over again in another section of his layout two weeks later. I think Tom is wanting to run a Christmas train or two on the new layout, so we're working toward having it all wrapped up before Thanksgiving.

A VISIT TO THE LITTLE RIVER RAILROAD & LUMBER COMPANY MUSEUM

During our trip to the Smoky Mountains in late August, Barbara and I stopped in at the Little River Railroad & Lumber Company Museum in Townsend, TN. We'd spent the morning and early afternoon in the Cades Cove area. To get from there to our next stop, the Look Rock Tower, we had to exit the National Park, travel a few miles along a state highway, and then go back into the park. The museum is along that path. We made it to the museum about two hours before closing and spent about an hour and a half on our visit. It was well worth the time. Both Barbara and I highly recommend the detour if you're ever in the area. Be sure to check the website (and maybe make a phone call) before you go, just to make sure they'll be open when you plan to visit.

Established in 1982, there is a LOT of history in that little museum! Over the period of about 38 years, the railroad helped clear 560 million board feet of lumber off of 100,000 acres of land. In 1925, 76,507 acres of land were purchased from W.B. Townsend by the State of Tennessee to ultimately establish the Great Smoky Mountains National Park in 1934. The sawmill was closed in 1938 and the railroad was abandoned in 1939.

There's no charge to visit the museum, either inside or out. Although, there are a few donation boxes and a gift shop, if you should feel inclined to either donate or shop. We, of course, did both. I think Bob Dawson & I are going to coproduce a presentation for the Louisville Chapter of the National Railroad Historical Society about the history of the railroad. We'll be sure to let y'all know when that happens.

Right: The star piece of equipment at the museum is "Dorothy," a 3-truck 70-ton Class-C Shay locomotive built in 1909. 2147 was originally built for the Babcock Lumber Company, but worked for the Little River Lumber Company between 1932 and 1935. By 1965 it was a hanger queen on a tourist railroad in North Carolina, providing parts to two other operating Shays. Finally, in 1985, it was back in Townsend as the first piece of equipment for the museum. It is the only remaining Shay from the Railroad. (continued on page 9)

Right: Inside the museum, you'll find many photos and artifacts from both the railroad and the logging company. Almost all items are well-marked, with detailed information about the history of the items.



Right: That's the strangest looking "observation car" I've ever seen! Usually, it's just a platform off the backend of a fancy coach, but not the Little River's Elkmont. They converted a gondola for the job. And, there were at least TWO of these things. Although, the other one wasn't quite as fancy as the Elkmont.

Left: Other than the equipment stored outside or in the workshop, this building houses the museum's artifacts. It is the original Walland, TN, depot. It was moved to the museum many years ago, from near where the Little River would interchange with the Southern. The other structure that visitors can enter, which is now the museum's gift shop, is a replica of the post office that served the logging town of Elkmont, TN.




