#### **FIRST PLACE**

Left: Chris Broughton's HO "Albany Office Building." Chris kit-bashed the structure using four City Classics, East Ohio Street buildings. The building was spray painted in layers beginning with the window frames. Small details were painted by hand. Weathering was applied with a combination of airbrushing and chalks. Store interiors were made from photos found on line and photo-edited.

## **SECOND PLACE**

Right: Jody McNutt's HO, "My Engine House." This is a 3D printed model of an Engine House that Jody downloaded from KABRUMBLE

https://www.thingiverse.com/thing:44 41261. He added a shingled roof, interior and exterior lights. The exterior and interior were painted and dry brushed with powders.





# THIRD PLACE

Left: Bob Kuchler's MMR® N-Scale "American Equipment Company Factory."

Bob Built this large factory using two Brach's Candy Factory kits and some brick sheet and Evergreen Styrene strips. Many roof details were added and the building stretched with the additional materials. It was then painted including using a rubber roller rolled over black paint and then the windows to paint the framing. The sign is from City Classics. Bob lost the loading dock doors over the years, and replaced them with television screen material.






Left: Ed Brennan's HO "1950's M.J. Clark Grocery Store." Ed "revived" this from his extras box. He stripped off an ugly shade of latex green from the model and repainted it with a spray of Floquil white paint. Clear acetate was installed behind the window frames and door frame. Signs, some downloaded and printed, were attached with Elmer's Glue.

Right: Bob Frankrone's HO "Sunrise Feed and Seed." This is a Walthers Cornerstone kit that Bob built, painted, weathered, and detailed.



Left: Al Goodman's HO "Fenced Highway Bridge." Al built this from Rix Products HO kits. LED street lights were added. The fence structures were made from styrene heated with a heat gun, bent to shape and cut to length. The fencing was made from bridal tulle cloth, cut on skew and air brushed painted steel for galvanized steel appearance. The cloth was CA cemented to the support posts and strip styrene supports the curved line of fencing.






