#### **FIRST PLACE**

Ed Brennan's "HO U.S. Air Force S-I Switcher."

Ed had the opportunity to "drive" the prototype of this locomotive while he was the commander of an Air Force Logistics Group. This is an Atlas model that was released with the same number as the engine that Ed operated. Ed made a few changes to the stock model, to include the LEDs for lighting and replacing the stock couplers with Kadee #5 units. He added a TCS decoder to give him the DCC capability he really wanted.

#### **SECOND PLACE**

Right: Bob Kuchler's MMR® N Scale "Doodlebug."

This is an N scale Bachmann
Doodlebug. Bob disassembled it and
converted it to DCC by installing a
Digitrax decoder which involved
hardwiring it. While the body was off,
he painted it in Milwaukee Road colors,
added decals, and then weathered it
with paint and chalks. Knuckle couplers
were added as this model was old
enough to have had the Rapido style
originally.



#### **THIRD PLACE**

Randy Griggs' "S Scale EMD SW 1001 Switcher."

Randy scratch built this model with 3-D Printing using scaled up N Scale Plans. He installed American Flyer compatible couplers. Trucks, side frames, and wheel sets were 3-D printed. He added 3-D printed interior cab details. Paint scheme is based on a CSX prototype. The model is currently unpowered, but he plans to power it in the near future.

Bob began with an Athearn undecorated F45 locomotive Athearn blue box kit. He painted and decaled the model to represent what a Southern Railway F45 could have looked like had they purchased any.






